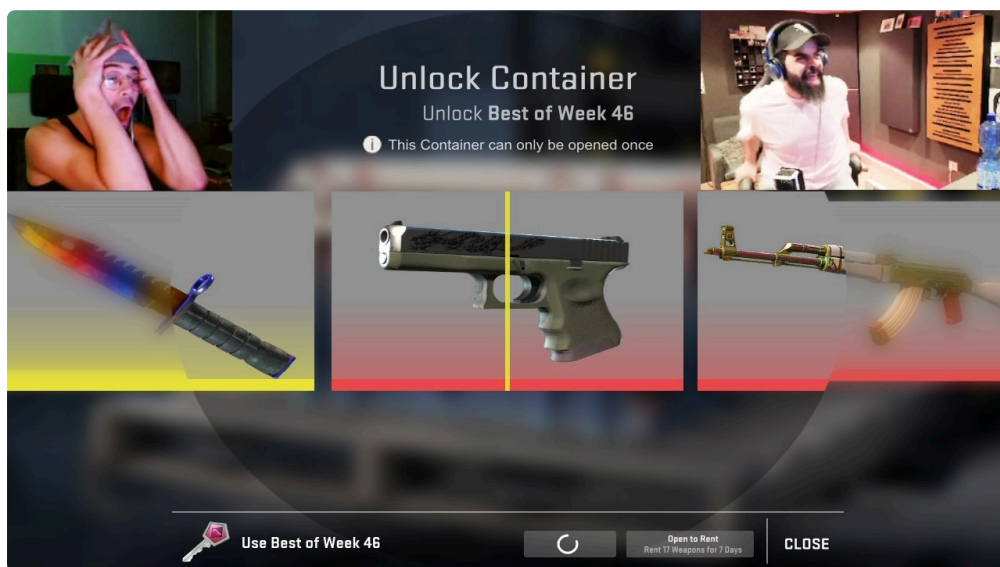
What Are CSGO Skin Cases?

* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the chance that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) product, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The specific probability for each specific skin within that tier is a separate, undisclosed estimation.

The table demonstrates that while the majority of cases cost just a couple of dollars, the probability of landing a high-value skin stays really low. Players should therefore see case opening as a type of home entertainment instead of a reputable financial investment.
