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Renting the incorrect storage unit typically exposes itself in one of 2 undesirable methods. You either pay month after month for empty air, or you spend moving day playing a sweaty, discouraging game of real-life Tetris, convinced that a person more light, one more lug, another dining chair must somehow fit. The majority of people lean on rough guesses when choosing among storage units, and that is where trouble starts.

A great fit is not just about square footage. It is about how your possessions behave in a room. A queen bed mattress is awkward in methods a stack of boxes is not. A washer and clothes dryer set can consume a surprising quantity of floor space.
