- **Coinflip:** A simple 50/50 (or near it) head-to-head video game where two players wager skins of equal value, and a virtual coin flip identifies the winner.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn arbitrarily, with higher-value deposits increasing a gamer's analytical opportunity of winning the whole pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both include betting, CS2 gambling varies significantly from traditional online gambling in regards to currency, availability, and neighborhood combination.
