Orchestration vs Switching: The Real Product Category

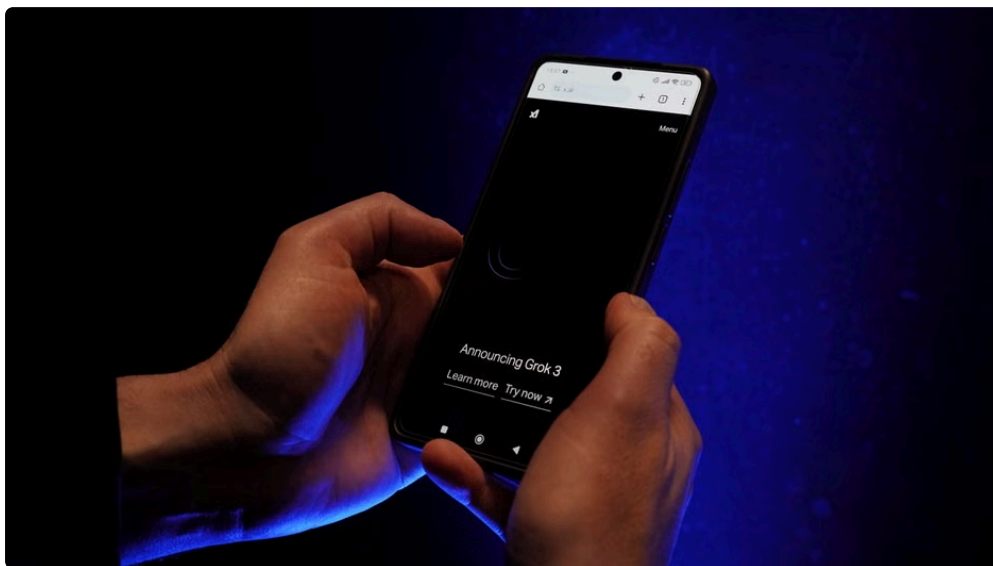
