3. Prime Status Benefits

As mentioned, having Prime Status is non-negotiable for major gamers looking to earn free items. Prime players are matched with other Prime users (reducing cheater encounters) and are specifically eligible for weekly care packages that include important weapon cases and random skin drops.

4. Major Tournaments and View Passes

Throughout Valve-sponsored CS2 Major championships, audiences can purchase or often make Souvenir Packages.

- By watching the tournament live by means of the Steam television or in-game customer, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, players can make Souvenir Cases particular to that tournament.
- These cases do not require a crucial to open, making them 100% complimentary value when acquired.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)
