How "Provably Fair" Systems Work

2. **Client Seed:** The player's browser produces another random string (or allows the user to input their own).
3. **The Roll/Outcome:** When integrated, the server seed, customer seed, and a nonce (a counter) generate the last outcome.
4. **Verification:** After the round concludes, the unhashed server seed is revealed. The player can input these variables into a verification tool to make sure your home did not manipulate the roll.
