* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the possibility that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) item, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The specific possibility for each particular skin within that tier is a separate, undisclosed calculation.

The table demonstrates that while many cases cost just a couple of dollars, the likelihood of landing a high-value skin remains very low. Players should for that reason see case opening as a type of home entertainment rather than a trustworthy investment.

Top 5 CSGO Cases by Resale Value
