London City Airport started this fee scheme to regulate vehicle access close to the terminal and encourage the use of [pre-book airport parking](#) alternatives like park and ride or public transport.

Drop-Off Fees Rising Quietly Across UK Airports

London City is not alone. Across the UK, **drop-off charges have been steadily rising** – often quietly, with passengers only finding out when they're paying the extra. Here are some key notes about the current landscape:

- Average **UK drop-off charge** is now **£6.51** per visit, according to our latest data.
- London City's £6 fee is close to the average but still significant relative to many other airports.
- Some of the most expensive airports for drop-off fees include Heathrow, Gatwick, and Manchester, with charges sometimes exceeding £8-£10.
