

# CS2 Knife Opening: A Comprehensive Guide to Unboxing in Counter-Strike 2

## 3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The official drop probabilities (as published by Valve) for each rarity in a standard CS2 case are:

Rarity	Approximate Drop Rate
Mil-Spec (Blue)	79.92%
Restricted (Purple)	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	3.20%
Covert (Red)	0.64%
Rare Special Item (Gold)-- Knife	<b>0.25%</b>

Thus, on average, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The exact knife model (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is picked from a pool of offered knives for that case, each similarly most likely within the Rare Special Item tier.

## 4. Normal Knives and Market Values

Below is a list of the most sought-after knives, in addition to their average market rate (as of early 2026). Rates can vary dramatically based upon float, stattrak, and stage.

## 5. Methods for Responsible Knife Opening

While the result is largely RNG, there are a few practical steps that can help you manage expectations and secure your bankroll.

### 5.1. Set a Budget

- **Decide in advance** just how much you want to invest in secrets, and adhere to that limitation.
- Treat the purchase as entertainment, not a financial investment.

### 5.2. Choose the Right Case

- **Operation Broken Fang** and **Revolution** cases tend to have greater typical knife worth returns, however they are also more costly per secret.
- If you want a specific knife (e.g., Karambit), target the case that includes it.

- Use third-party trackers (e.g., CSGOStash, Buff163) to see rate variations.
- Buying a case when the marketplace is saturated can reduce the resale rate of the resulting skin.

- Throughout major sales (e.g., Steam Summer Sale) keys may be discounted.
- Some third-party sites use "free" everyday cases-- use them to increase opening volume without additional cost.

- In numerous jurisdictions, opening loot boxes is restricted for minors. Ensure compliance with regional age guidelines.
- Avoid grey-market websites that promise "ensured" knives; these frequently breach Valve's Terms of Service and can cause account restrictions.
