

The first time I aided a next-door neighbor install a sprinkler system, we allotted one weekend. We ended up on the third, sore, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system functioned, although we invested the next month dialing in head positioning, repairing tiny leaks, and finding out why water stress theoretically does not constantly match what comes out of a trench line after 8 tees and a surge in quality. 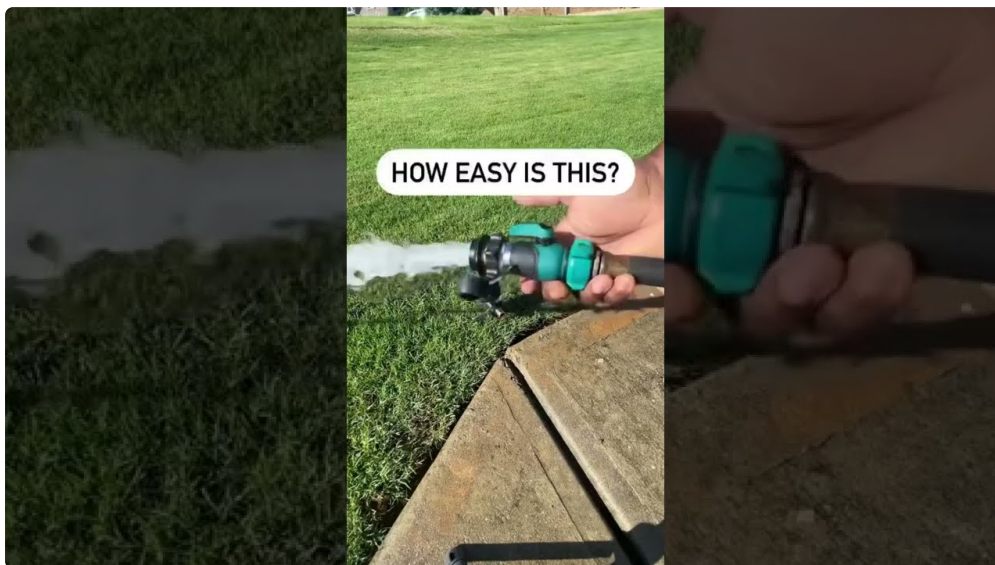

The most significant distinction I see between home owner systems and expert installs is not brand name or part high quality. It is style and tuning.
